

To relieve the pressure on the Administration Desk at this time and to cut down on the queues, we are leaving the web site on-line entries open right up until Noon Thursday 22nd February closing time for players wishing to enter and pay on-line by credit card.

You will still be able to pay at the Administration Desk using cash, cheque or credit card. Changes to existing entries (different players, changing events, cancellations etc.) will need to be done at the Administration Desk however any changes will incur a \$10.00 administrative fee except for Open Teams Members placed in the top ten teams after round 11 of the qualifying.

So, avoid the queues, and enter online using your iPad, notebook or smartphone.

YOUTH, STUDENT AND OTHER CONCESSIONAL ENTRY FEES-ADVISE WHEN ENTERING

- Courtesy of the Gold Coast Congress, all players born on or after 1st January 1998 are entitled to free entry.
- In accordance with Australian Bridge Federation policy, all players born between 1st January 1993 and 31st.
 December 1997 inclusive are entitled to a 50% discount on entry fees.
- Courtesy of the Gold Coast Congress, all players born BEFORE 1st January 1918 are entitled to free entry.

PARKING

Parking will be available for \$12 per entry per day or \$60 for a weekly pass with unlimited entry from Saturday 17th February to Saturday 24th February inclusive.

The Bridge Administration Desk is the ONLY place you can obtain a weekly pass. It will be open on Friday 16th February from Noon until 30 minutes after play finishes. Weekly passes can only be used from Saturday to Saturday inclusive.

For those requiring casual day parking, a one entry one exit ticket will be available from the machine upon entry. Those parking will need to pay \$12 on departure at the pay stations which are located at the lifts as you are exiting. Note that the \$12 ticket is a one entry and one exit ticket so if you intend to leave between sessions you will be required to pay a second \$12 parking fee.

BRIDGEMATES

If you have never used the Bridgemate Scoring Units we suggest you arrive a few minutes before your first session and ask a Director for a quick tutorial. We are confident that your opponents will also help you to use this user friendly technology.

PLAYER NUMBERS FOR THE TEAMS USING BRIDGEMATE II

During the team events, when you turn on the Bridgemates, you will be asked to enter your player numbers. This is NOT your ABF number. Each player in every team has been assigned a number. These will be found on the bright orange sheet which will be on your table at the start of play. NS at the home table should enter the player numbers for the players in your own team.

The reason for this is that, if done correctly, the scoring team will produce a summary of the results for each pair in your team, comparing their results against the average score across your section on each board (the datum). These results have no official status and are just for your own interest. It is a service we are happy to be able to provide, but in order to take advantage of it, it is important that the player numbers are accurately entered each round.

Our observations from recent years show that over 90% of teams sit in the same seats for the whole event. To simplify the process for entering player numbers for these teams, from Round 2 onwards if your team is sitting in the same seats as in Round 1, you may just enter "1" for all four players. The unit will display "same as Round 1" as the player names and the system will correctly record the pairs.

WEB RESULTS PAGE

On the 2018 GCC Results Page, <u>http://www.qldbridge.com/gcc/results2018.php</u> (or if you hate typing like your editors <u>https://tinyurl.com/y7qfrojh</u>), there is an option, "Individual Player Results." Click on this and enter your surname or ABF number (or anyone else whose results you may be interested in). You will now see a list of every session in which you played at the 2018 GCC, your score, the number of masterpoints won, and a link to your scorecard for the session. (This page will be updated at the end of each day's play).

CORRECTING SCORES

After each session, a printout of the results for each pair or team will be made available. For the last session of a stage of an event, you may obtain a copy on request from the Scoring Enquiries Desk located outside the scoring room just inside the doors in the centre of the playing area.

If you believe that there is a mistake, you need to follow this procedure:

- 1. on the board where you believe that there was an error, agree with your opponents that the score was entered incorrectly;
- 2. make the correction on your printout and have them sign it;
- 3. give the corrected printout to the Scoring Liaison Officer, Toni Bardon, under the sign "SCORING ENQUIRIES" outside the scoring room just inside the door in the centre of the playing area. She will check that you have provided all the necessary information. The correction will be made by the scorers during the following session and a new personal printout will be made available for you to collect.

Agreed scoring errors need to be advised within the scoring correction period for the session in which the error occurred. The scoring correction periods are displayed prominently near the scoreboards. At the conclusion of the scoring correction period, scores become final and, under the Laws of Bridge, no further changes can be made. This is critical for the last rounds when the correction period is limited and scorers may not pick up anomalies. You are responsible for your own actions - or lack thereof.

World Championships have been awarded based on scoring errors. E/W Pairs should not simply acknowledge the scores on the Bridgemates, but should carefully check them as incorrect scores, apart from affecting the results of the event which may involve others not related to the scoring error, but may also affect: draws for teams and Swiss Pairs events, Masterpoints, Playoff Qualifying Points.

SYSTEMS - WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW

Each pair is required to have two current ABF approved, systemically identical system cards on the table for the opposing pair before the start of each round. Overseas players will be permitted to use New Zealand and WBF system cards in addition to ABF cards.

Subject to protection, **GREEN**, **BLUE** and **RED** systems as well as **BROWN Sticker** conventions may be used during the Open Pairs and Teams, Seniors Pairs and Teams, Intermediate Pairs and Teams, Seres-McMahon Swiss Pairs, Ivy Dahler Open Swiss Pairs, Ivy Dahler Intermediate Swiss Pairs, Weekend Matchpoint, Monday Butler Swiss Pairs and Under 500MP events. (Note: protection will not be available for the major final of the Open Pairs).

Only **GREEN** and **BLUE** systems may be used during the Restricted Pairs and Teams, Novice Pairs and Teams, Rookie Pairs, Friday Novice Pairs, Ivy Dahler Restricted Swiss Pairs and Under 50 Masterpoint Pairs.

YELLOW systems will only be permitted in the Open Teams from Round 3 onwards and not against teams with a current position in the lower two thirds of the field (decimals rounded up).

Teams proposing to use YELLOW systems should have already lodged an adequate copy of their system (including a bona fide suggested defence) with the CTD before 10:00am on Tuesday 6th February 2018. Such systems are available for inspection as well as posted on the Gold Coast Congress website using the information tab.

BROWN STICKER

Some overcalls and 2-level openings attract a **BROWN sticker**. Weak 2-level openings without an anchor suit (RCO and Myxo Twos, etc.) are **BROWN sticker**. Pairs should attach **BROWN** spots to their cards. Also, multi one-level overcalls are **BROWN**, though gadgets used over 1NT or a strong 1[‡] are not. Please also note that a Multi 2[‡] (or 2[‡]) showing a Weak Two in either major is an exemption from the **BROWN Sticker** category.

PROTECTED PAIRS

Pairs playing a **GREEN** system can apply for an Orange sticker if both are below Life Master or one is below State Master.

This affords protection from **BROWN Sticker** conventions in all events where they are permitted with the exception of the major Final of the Open Pairs.

ALERTS - SUMMARY

PRE-ALERTS

List your unusual or complex treatments in the pre-alerts section of the system card. For instance – RCO 2s, Bergen raises, DONT Dbl vs 1NT, unusual carding (leading low from doubletons, etc).

ANNOUNCEMENTS

Announce the number of clubs contained in a 1♣ opening and the HCP range of a 1NT opening. Those playing a strong club system just need to announce 1♣ as "Strong 16+".

ALERTS DURING THE AUCTION

Alert by circling partner's call and saying "Alert" but don't offer an explanation unless asked (then aim to be concise, yet complete).

DON'T ALERT:

- Any double or redouble
- Any call beyond 3NT, except a conventional opening bid
- A bid of a suit bid or shown by an opponent
- Any 24 response to a INT opening bid in an uncontested auction (*e.g. Stayman*)

For our New Zealand players We do NOT use STOP Cards

DO ALERT:

All other conventional calls (such as *Transfers*, 2♥=hearts and *a minor etc.*)

'Unusual' natural bids. These include: weak jump shift responses, pre-emptive jump raises, inverted minors, canapé tendency, negative free bids, transfer accepts that deny four trumps, etc.

At the end of the auction, the declaring side should mark any unusual calls that weren't alerted at the time. Do this with a plus sign (+).

IF PARTNER STUFFS UP

Declarer/Dummy: If partner fails to alert or provides a wrong or misleading explanation, you should wait until the *end of the auction* before calling the Director and correcting.

Defenders: wait until the *end of the hand* before piping up.

THE NEW LAWS - INFORMATION FOR PLAYERS

Matthew McManus

In August this year, the new Laws of Bridge came into force in Australia. In many cases, the variations are of little practical effect. I have summarised some of the more significant changes that players may notice and need to know about. This summary is not intended as a complete description of the relevant laws.

Unintended calls

The opportunities to change an unintended call have been significantly reduced. An error which arises because of the player's loss of concentration as to the level of the auction can no longer be changed. This is the case even though the call may not be one which the player ever intended to make. For example, with spades agreed as trumps, West bids 4NT, Blackwood. East responds 5H (two without the queen). West starts thinking about whether to bid the slam or sign off at the five level. Eventually, he decides that 5S is enough, but this decision comes out as Pass. Even though he never intended to pass, he can no longer change the call to the bid of 5S he intended. (The same restriction will apply in other similar situations: for example, when a player passes an artificial Bergen-style raise.)

The same principle now also applies in regard to declarer's call of a card from dummy. Effectively, only legitimate slips of the tongue can now be changed. Loss of concentration or changes of mind are not viable excuses to correct. For instance, saying "small, I mean ace" will now mean that no change is allowed. The director can allow a change if he is satisfied that it was just a slip of the tongue. Potential allowable examples:

- 1. "king of hearts, I mean king of diamonds"
- 2. "small spade" while declarer is pointing at dummy's clubs

Calling the Director

It has always been a requirement in the Laws that the director be called whenever there is an irregularity. This has been reinforced in the new laws. It may become particularly relevant if, at the end of the auction, the

declaring side reveals that there has been incorrect information given about their bidding. If the players fail to call the director at the time and it turns out that the director could have done something to rectify it had he been called, then both sides are liable to get their worst possible score on the board.

The new law specifically states that ignorance of the law is no excuse.

Calls out of turn

Under the old laws, the penalties arising due to calls out of rotation could be very harsh. Often times, a player's partner was barred from bidding for the whole auction. Under the new laws, the partner can make his normal call. Depending on the action now taken by the player who originally called out of turn, the auction will either continue without penalty or the player's partner will have to pass for one round. The director will make a determination on a case by case basis using the guidelines in the laws regarding "comparable calls".


Claims

Previously when there was a claim, play stopped. If there was any dispute it was decided by the director. Now, play may be continued at the request of the non-claiming side provided all four players at the table agree. The result obtained at the table will stand.

PLAY BRIDGE WITH BARRY

The deals in this year's Bulletin feature some unusual card play combinations. Would you have found either West's or South's play here?



The contestants in this deal were Van Richard (South) and Ed Chapin (West), playing with their wives, Jane and Hilda. How should the play go in three no-trumps after West leads the queen of hearts? Declarer saw seven top tricks: one spade, two hearts, two diamonds and two clubs. So, he needed to develop two extra club tricks, since four club tricks would be enough to see him home. Clearly, there was no problem if the five missing clubs were splitting 3-2. Equally, the contract was in trouble if East had four clubs to the queen. But what if it was West who had the queen of clubs in a four-card suit? If you finesse early in clubs you get only three tricks in the suit, since there are no entries to table to reach the good clubs.

Since declarer did not want to risk a spade switch, he won the ♥A, and had to decide what to do next. One approach is to duck a club immediately, but Richard cashed the king of clubs first, planning to duck the second club when West followed low. That would enable him to take the marked finesse in clubs on the next round of the suit if the suit was 4-1. However, when he led the second club, Chapin played his queen!

If ever anyone looked like a man who had started with a favourable doubleton queen of clubs, Chapin was that man. But Richard wasn't going to risk his contract for an insignificant overtrick. He called for a low club from the dummy and gave his opponent a knowing smile as the bad split came to light. He could now bring in the club suit for four tricks, and make his contract.

The writer remarked that he wished fighting was always that bloodless; but this hand just goes to show that at Bridge it is a lot more acceptable to use your head than at boxing.

WELCOME TO NEW PLAYERS AT THE GCC

Welcome to the Gold Coast Congress. If this is your first as a newcomer, get ready for a great experience. If it's not your first, you have an idea about what you can expect, and you know you are in for a good time. To start you off on the right foot, here's a story to remind you that bridge is supposed to be fun.

In a light-hearted moment, a player asked his wife if she loved him more than bridge. "Of course," she said. "How about 7NT redoubled?" he continued. The wife thought it over for a minute then said, "Making?"

These columns are highlighting common errors and how to avoid them. We start with one of my pet peeves.

Off-shape takeout doubles

I once played against a bright intermediate player, a person I thought had potential. I changed my mind, at least for the time being, after I opened 1 and he made a takeout double with hand roughly like this one:

♠ A 8 6
♥ Q J 4 3
♦ 7
♣ A K 6 5 2

I ended up playing a spade contract, and as the play progressed, it became obvious he had a singleton diamond. When the play was over, his partner made a remark about the double. His response: "But I had 14 points!"

That seems to be the mantra for many players who apparently were daydreaming or nodding off when the bridge teacher covered takeout doubles.

To be effective, a bridge partnership must have good communication. If you double an opening bid and put down a doubleton or a singleton in a suit partner bids, he is not going to be happy. Over time, partner will start responding to your doubles at a minimum level even when he has enough to bid higher because he will worry about what's coming down in dummy. No one likes to play 4-2 or 4-1 fits, especially doubled. When you make these undisciplined bids, the opponents – with more trumps than your side – will often pull out the red card.

But, you say, "If partner bids my doubleton, I can just bid no-trump, right?"

That is 100% wrong unless you have significant extras. You should never, ever double and bid no-trump with minimum or even medium values.

A double followed by a bid in no-trump shows a hand that is too strong to overcall 1NT directly. If your 1NT overcall range is 15-17, double then no-trump shows a good 18 or more high-card points in a balanced hand with a stopper in opener's suit.

You can, of course, double without support for unbid suits when you have a very strong hand, perhaps

♠ AKQJ943 ♥ A ♦ KJ6 ♣ 109

A simple overcall risks missing game, so double and bid your suit over partner's response to show this kind of hand.



West leads the \$A-\$2-\$9 (reverse count) and \$10 from declarer, West, switches to the \$8-\$2-\$A-\$J. What next?



Solution: Contract: 4♥ by South. Lead: ♣A.

After the A, West switched to the A-A-A-A, East reverted to clubs, hoping West had started with five clubs only. South ruffed, knocked out the A and had ten tricks. East-West made their three aces, but no more.

At trick 3, East should return a spade. When West plays the \blacklozenge 5, East knows West began with a doubleton spade. On coming in with the \blacklozenge A, East can give West a spade ruff. The \blacklozenge 8 could be a singleton (possible, but not likely) or top from a doubleton or \blacklozenge Q-10-8.

South's $\blacklozenge J$ could not be a singleton. That would mean West had led the $\blacklozenge 8$ from $\blacklozenge Q-10-8-5$. Impossible. From that, West would lead the $\blacklozenge 5$ or possibly the $\blacklozenge Q$.

When East returns a spade at trick three, if West shows a doubleton, the rest is easy. If it transpires that West began with \blacklozenge Q-10-8, the spade return does no harm. East can still play for a second club trick when in with the \blacklozenge A after the spade position has been clarified.

ZEPHYR 2018 GOLD COAST CONGRESS CHARITY

My name is Carmel Martin. I'm a bridge player and the treasurer of Zephyr Education Inc. Most bridge players now know about Zephyr as this is the third year that the QBA, under the auspices of Theresa Tully, Kim Ellaway, Richard Wallis and Tim Runting, has sponsored Zephyr as its official Gold Coast Congress charity.

Owing to the huge support and generosity shown by the bridge community, \$34,000 was raised last year. All of that money has been used to do a great deal of good. 1400 children were helped by Zephyr last financial year and more shelters have been taken on since then.

Helping children affected

by domestic violence

get back to school

In April 2013, my sister, Isabella, read an article in the Courier Mail highlighting the plight of mothers and their children arriving at domestic violence shelters, often with only the clothes on their backs. The article made a plea for essential school items for the children, such as school bags and shoes.

A drastic consequence of the upheaval in the lives of these children is that their education is often severely disrupted. This makes their transition to a new school in a new location far more difficult, firstly because without the proper clothing and equipment they stand out from the other children at a time when it is important for their self-confidence that they fit in. Secondly, without the relevant text books etc they will quickly fall behind in their schooling. They encounter many other problems, two examples of which are that without a hat they may run up against the 'no hat no play' rule, or without proper school shoes they may not be allowed to play sport.

We decided to set up a charity focusing on supplying uniforms, shoes, text books, stationery, school bags, lunch boxes, water bottles, swim wear and other school items. We also pay resource and other fees as required.

Research shows that it is vital for the children's well-being that they get back to school as soon as possible and that they don't stand out from other children at their new school during this difficult time. Therefore, we respond to requests from shelters (usually), within 24 hours.

This charity is all about volunteers. Everyone who works for Zephyr is a volunteer. No one is paid to work or reimbursed for private expenses.

Your Support: As a bridge player, I turned to the bridge community for donations when we realized that the size of the charity was going to go beyond the boundaries of our two families and close friends. The support from the bridge community has been overwhelming, humbling and gratefully received. Apart from the hugely generous financial support we've received, we've been spurred on by the massive endorsement of what we are trying to do. Bill Haughie informs me that the bridge community regards Zephyr as their charity. I know I'm talking in superlatives but there are no words big enough to describe the support we continue to receive. Everyone is drawn to the idea that you can break the cycle of disadvantage with education.

At the time of the Gold Coast Congress 2016 we were supporting 16 refuges. In December 2016, that figure numbered 41 refuges. On Christmas Eve we registered our 60th Queensland shelter and we support all 7 shelters in Tasmania. The Qld shelters stretch from Weipa to the Gold Coast and west to Mt Isa and beyond. Our hope is to replicate this simple, highly effective, successful model in other states. One shelter which we assist in Tasmania supports men and their children. Zephyr is about the needs of the children but parents, teachers, coordinators and others involved also benefit hugely.

Domestic violence has reached epidemic proportions in Australia and any help you can provide to help children affected by it to get on with their education would be much appreciated.

Over time the organisers have noticed that there are areas where it is particularly cold due to air pockets coming from the air conditioner.


The room sometimes leaks from condensation due to the amount of air conditioning we are using.


