
Bridge with Richard Ward

North's 3S bid is a 'splinter' – a game force in diamonds with a singleton spade. South has a minimum hand, although the two aces are a positive feature, and settles in 5D. West leads the spade king and, when dummy appears, declarer notes that he would have to be terribly unlucky not to make 11 tricks, maybe even 12. The percentage play in trumps is to finesse for the diamond king but, if it loses, there is a two-way guess in clubs which would be best avoided. The optimal solution is to win the spade ace, ruff a spade, cash the diamond ace hoping for a 2-1 break (key play), then take the three heart winners. Now the defenders can be put on play with their diamond king, whoever has it, and then either a club or a spade return will solve all problems.
